ALL: May God forgive you, Christ renew you and the Spirit enable you to grow in love.

ONE: Amen.

and the life of all the world is not whole.

ONE: May God forgive you, Christ renew you and the Spirit enable you to grow in love.

ALL: Amen.

ASSURANCE

ONE: Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through Jesus, the Christ.

ALL: Through Jesus we have obtained access to the grace in which we stand, and we

rejoice in our hope of sharing the glory of God. Amen.

COMMUNION PRAYERS

PASTOR: This table is open to all who call Jesus Lord and Savior, all who wish to share in the

community of God's people. Let us share in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. In the

beginning, God made the world:

Reader: Made it and mothered it,

Reader: Shaped it and fathered it;

Reader: Filled it with the seed of all that is good,

ALL: Filled it with life and with song and variety PASTOR: All that is green, blue, deep and growing:

ALL: The hand of God created us.

PASTOR: All that is tender, firm, fragrant and curious:

ALL: The hand of God created us. PASTOR: The world belongs to God,

ALL: The earth and all its people.

PASTOR: When the time was right, God sent the Messiah.

READER: Sent and nurtured Jesus, READER: Reared and risked Jesus;

READER: Filled Jesus with laughter, tears and compassion,

READER: With love, devotion and with anger at injustice.

ALL: Jesus, the Messiah, is God's own Child.

PASTOR: Feeder, teacher and healer, lover of the unlovable, the one who touched the

untouchable, forgiver of the unforgivable,

ALL: Jesus, the Messiah, is God's own Child.

PASTOR: Loved by the least, feared by the leaders; befriended by the weak, despised by the

strong; deserted by those who listened, denied by friends; bone of our bone, flesh of our

flesh, writing heaven's pardon over the earth,

ALL: Jesus, the Messiah, is God's own Child.

PASTOR: The Word became flesh,

ALL: And lived among us, and was one of us.

ONE: When the world became impatient with love

READER: Carpenters took up their tools,

READER: And made a cross for God's own Child,

READER: Fashioned from wood and the skill of human hands, ALL: Fashioned from hate and the will of human minds.

PASTOR: And Jesus was summoned to the judgment hall, an enemy of the state, a danger to the

religious authorities, and was judged.

ALL: Bone of our bone, flesh of our flesh.

PASTOR: Jesus died, declaring God's forgiveness, rose on the third day, transforming death,

ascended into heaven, and is everywhere on earth. Jesus sent the Holy Spirit as the seal of the intention of God. Jesus sets before us bread and wine, and invites us to the table. This is the place where we are shown God's love, where we are one in Christ, the

Messiah. For God sent the Messiah not to condemn the world,

ALL: But that the world, through Jesus, might participate in the salvation God offers.

PASTOR: Holy God, we praise You for Your creation, and remember Your covenant made with

Your people, shown to us in fullness with the birth of Your child, Jesus, and completed in the resurrection of the Christ. We remember, too, that on the night of betrayal, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to the disciples saying: "This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, Jesus took the cup, saying: "This is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it

in remembrance of me."

Consecrate, therefore, by Your Holy Spirit, O God, these gifts, and bless us that, as we receive them, we may be united with Christ and one another, and continue to be faithful in all things. Amen.

Let us proclaim with these ancient words what we believe.

ALL: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

PASTOR: Let us now pray, as the saints who have witnessed to us and preceded us throughout

the ages have prayed by saying The Lord's Prayer.

THE LORD'S PRAYER (trespass)

ALL: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

PASTOR: Through the broken bread we participate in the body of Christ and through the cup of

blessing we participate in the new life Christ gives.

ALL: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us.

ALL: Making us whole for the good of the earth.
PASTOR: For bread and wine, for this place and this time,

ALL: Thanks be to God.

PASTOR: For the peace which is not of this world,

ALL: Thanks be to God.

PASTOR: For the hope of heaven on earth and the final song of joy,

ALL: Thanks be to God.
