Core Value Moment (8/28/22) Spiritually Alive by Pat Burke

I was asked to talk today on the core value: Being Spiritually Alive. This will NOT be a Theology of the Holy Spirit, but simply some of my personal experiences, perspective and understanding.

In John 14:26 ... "but the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send you in my name will teach you everything."

It was not until I became a part of UCC Norwich that I had a desire to learn about the Holy Spirit. However my motivation was very low. It took years for me to grasp what things the Holy Spirit could teach me. Faith, Hope and Love seemed like the place to start.

What is faith? It is a gift from God, but is not an instant present. It develops over time. Consider the seed of a desire planted, it takes quite a while to germinate and grow before it can bear fruit. The more it is nurtured, the more robust it will be. Prayer is the sun, water and fertilizer of FAITH and the Holy Spirit shows us the way. HOPE is the desire to be, have or do and Prayer provides the energy of the Holy Spirit. Love also grows with prayer and the Holy Spirit taught me to see others the way God sees us.

I have a personal experience I will share with you to underscore what I am trying to say. I am an introvert, so I felt the restrictions of Covid to be a gift. But it soon became apparent that the UCC Norwich needed ways to stay in touch with each other.

One of the many ways was to develop a Prayer Group. Initially there was a lot interest, but over time a core group of four, with others who attend when time allows, was formed. We meet Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 10 a.m. for one hour on Zoom. Over the past two years we have gotten to know and care deeply for each other. We are very open in asking questions that include personal growth and development of our soul and our lives. We maintain respect for information. We discuss the best ways of approach for sensitive areas in requests for prayers in and out of our UCC Congregation. We pray on requests for healing, clarity, change, to understand the will of God, etc.

However, there were people in my life who I had difficulty getting along with, difficulty even being around. At this point I turned to God with multiple questions and desires to be a better me. The answers to my prayers surprised me.

In one case a distant memory suddenly came in my mind like a vivid dream and I realized that I had hurt, offended, and been overall unkind to someone. I started to cry, because I could feel the pain I caused her when she was just trying to care for me. In time, I had no reservation apologizing to her and repairing the wrong I had done.

I continued to pray to the Lord to show me a way to feel love in areas where I had differences with people. This time the answer came in an unexpected thought in my mind, heart and body. "Be still and try to take a walk in their shoes." I did just that and now I feel love and acceptance for them and I thank God who took me on this path of love and caring.

To me now, to be Spiritually Alive means trying to live a life where I can share and embrace a life of Faith, Hope and Love through the Holy Spirit.

However, for me to do this I have to maintain a commitment to PRAYER.

THINK ABOUT:

- How does the wage gap impact us today? Racial wealth gap? Digital divide?
- How are families doing in rural, urban, and even the global economies?
- How are workers and other groups joining together to affect change and establish worker justice?

WAGE THEFT/FRAUD

Unfortunately it is quite common for employers to steal wages from workers, that is to fail to pay employees all they earn. Up to two-thirds of workers in low-wage industries are victims of wage theft each week. Failure to pay for all hours worked or for overtime are just some examples of the ways employers steal wages.

Ending wage theft in your community. Learn more. Low-wage workers are high-value people, created in the image of God. All jobs must provide fair wages, benefits, and working conditions. Workers must be able to support themselves and their families and live with dignity the life of wholeness that God intends for all. God's reign does not stop at the door to the workplace but extends to all aspects of life including our work lives.

One-third of the offering supports Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds are used by Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants to UCC churches and organizations as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. Livestream Team Update by Mary Williams

Our Livestream process will be undergoing an evaluation with a consultant from the Rochester area in September. If you have ideas or thoughts about our Livestream, please contact a member of the team: Pastor Jason Boyd, Jen Mallozzi, Chris McSweeney, Bob Oehme, Pete Williams, Mary Williams.

The Livestream Team attended a virtual webinar on August 14, 2022 called "Worship Planning Retreat: Re-Shaped". The keynote speaker was Jason Moore who specializes in a hybrid worship model that incorporates **both** live **and** online participants which he calls "both/and". Here are the highlights of his talk:

WHY do we need to continue hybrid worship?

- No one is an afterthought! We need to engage live AND at home audiences.
- Those who were or have felt shunned in worship have returned. Online worshiping has helped folks feel less vulnerable. Now that we have returned to in-person worship, we need to consider how to continue that welcome.
- Many folks who are not able to attend church have benefitted from virtual services. We must continue to minister to people in nursing homes, shut-ins, prisons, etc.
- Busy families, vacationers, travelers can worship from anywhere and at any time.
- Worship lives beyond Sunday. People can view a service any day of the week.
- Visitors can try out a church online first before visiting in person.
- We need to bring dignity and respect to the entire congregation (in-person is not better or more valid than online etc.).
- Geography no longer matters. "My parish is the world wide web!"
- Special needs families can worship at home without fear of judgment.
- A dialogue is now possible by using the "chat" feature on digital platforms. This can be used to engage at home viewers.
- Introverts and those with social anxiety can take a respite from in-person worship when needed.

- Those with hearing and visual difficulties can have an enhanced experience.
- Final thought: embracing hybrid worship is similar to embracing the early life of the church: think about how Paul wrote letters AND spoke in person!

- Celebrate the ministries of the church (ONA Forum, Music lesson scholarship program, music outreach, etc.)
- Use 3 existing bulletin boards to educate who is on (photos)/meeting dates/purpose of the church boards; Trustee, Deacon, and Executive Council
- Return the whiteboard to its location for use in meetings
- Discontinue or relocate the book rack
- Create four banners or a single application which communicates our four core values. Work with a professional graphic designer.
