From the Pastor

Autumn is by far my favorite season. I like the cooler weather, I like that I can count on being able to watch a whole lot of football, and I like the colors that emerge.

I recently had two separate experiences involving these wonderful colors of autumn that stand out. A few days ago, I was walking Scarlett down Main Street, going east from the parsonage, and I looked up to see the incredible colors of the foliage on the hill east of town, framed by the view down Main Street. It was just magnificent. The other experience was the appearance of an envelope in a bright autumn color on my desk recently – an orange one to be exact.

You might well ask what the big deal is about an orange envelope. Well, it contained a Halloween card, it had a dog on the front and some nice words about Scarlett, so that is always sure to make me smile — even though I truly could not care less about Halloween in general. But what else was contained in this envelope matching the color of many of the leaves is a big deal for all of us.

The card was sent to say how much someone enjoyed our Pet Blessing service. The author went on to say how she blessed her kittens at home along with us during our worship, and it even made a very specific lifting up of Jason Handy for his wonderful playing of the organ piece *Carnival of the Animals* during the service.

For all of us, here is why this is truly a big deal. The card was from someone none of you know (at least I think), who doesn't even live in our state. She had found the livestream services at my previous church, and upon learning I was called here to Norwich, apparently has followed me along to this congregation and is worshipping with us. Beloved ones, this matters because this is what we create and how we can reach people with our livestream. I think in many ways we have only scratched the service on how we can reach people and minister far beyond what we would have thought with our livestreaming.

I would add that there have now been over 300 separate views of Linda Oehme's Celebration of Life service on YouTube. That, more than just about anything, should tell us just how much our livestreaming can reach people, how much it matters to our worship and ministry.

In the days and weeks to come, there will be news about how we can improve what we do, and the work required for it. Among others, Jen Mallozzi and Chris McSweeney have been actively investigating and seeking ways to make our broadcast even more than it is. Techniques, new cameras, perhaps renovated space, and much more – they and others are on it. But I particularly want to lift them up as what they are doing each Sunday morning – and during the week out of our


view – is a true call from God and a beautiful ministry. I hope we will all support them to our fullest, and I would invite anyone who would like to learn more about how they make it all happen to talk with them, and perhaps even learn how to do it themselves as well. Alleluia and amen.

By the way, I would be remiss if I didn't mention that Advent starts in November. Advent is my favorite liturgical season by far, but I will have more to say about this in the December newsletter.

Let's All Read a Book Together!



Our faith grows more rich and deep through our study and seeking of knowledge, and this year, we have a special opportunity to combine fellowship with study – Pastor Jason is challenging the whole church to read a book together. There will be discussion groups, but even if you choose not to participate, you can still read along with the congregation.

The book is *The First Christmas*, by noted Jesus scholars Marcus Bork and John Dominic Crossan. The back cover of the book says these scholars "join forces to show how history has biased our reading of the nativity story as it appears in the gospels of Matthew and Luke. As they did for Easter in their previous book, The Last Week, here they explore the beginning of the life of Christ, peeling away the sentimentalism that has built up over the last two thousand years around this most well known of all stories to reveal the truth of what the gospels actually say. Borg and Crossan help us to see this well-known narrative afresh by answering the question, "What do these stories mean?" in the context of both the first century and the twenty-first century. They successfully show that the Christmas story, read in its original context, is far richer and more challenging than people imagine."

Sometime in early November, Pastor Jason will get us started on reading, and scheduling groups for discussion. So in the meantime, we will be ordering books through the church office. Please sign up in the church office (or call or email) if you want a book. This is a great way to do a deeper exploration of the life of our Savior as we move toward the celebration of His birth.

For some of these students, a private music education would not be possible were it not for UCC's music scholarship. For others, it would cause financial strain to the household budget already constrained by growing prices of, well, everything!

This money budgeted for music scholarships is going out to the community in a truly meaningful and beautiful way, shaping lives and fostering skills for individuals who will take this wherever they go! If that's not church, I don't know what is!




