## From the Pastor

Advent is upon us!

Some of you have heard me say this before, but now you all get to know: Advent is my favorite liturgical season of the church year. I will probably make a joke about how it is better than Lent at some point. ©

This wonderful season of watching and waiting began on November 27, and soon we will be doing what I refer to as "hanging the greens" as we start our collective journey of watching and waiting for the One who is come. This journey will take us through candles and cantatas and lead us to the manger. Along the way, we may do well to challenge ourselves anew in asking who Jesus is to us.

The United Church of Canada uses this question in its Advent candle-lighting liturgies in a program called Advent Unwrapped. This is not the liturgy we will be using this year (watch out for the future though!), but it still helps us reflect on the Advent journey to come, and what we might discern anew:

Who do you say Jesus is? We might say a wise teacher and guide who leads us to hope. We might say a firm foundation and careful gardener who nurtures peace. We might say a bright morning star who brings joy with His rising. We might say Emmanuel, God-with-us who spreads love. We might say all of those, and who knows what more.

I invite you to ask those questions for and of yourselves, and as we travel the road of Advent, as each candle is lit and each word is spoken, to make space for whatever new revelations the Holy Spirit of our Still-Speaking God may have to offer you.

Christmas is a glorious and joyful season for we as followers of Christ, but let us also remember that the journey to it matters, as does what we learn along the way. Christmas is a season that we've experienced myriad times before, but I invite you to allow yourself to imagine experiencing it again for the first time and discover what you learn about Jesus. Embrace the watching and waiting of Advent. Let yourself look for the signs of the One who is to come. Open yourself up to the Holy Spirit and see where it leads you as we journey to the manger these next few weeks.

### **Christmas Fund Collection**

News from The Pension Boards-United Church of Christ regarding The Christmas Fund for Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund Collection "Year after Year, Your Gift Brings Joy"

The Advent season of waiting and watching is also a season of preparing. Our generosity prepares the way for hope, peace, justice, and community. United Church of Christ retired clergy, servants of the church, have spent lifetimes baptizing and blessing, teaching and preaching, marrying and burying, comforting and empowering God's people. Now, through the Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross, we have the opportunity to sustain and empower them. Our gifts of gratitude and love bring hope to the hopeless, joy to the sorrowful, and deep love to those who have ministered in God's love for so long. By giving generously to the Christmas Fund, we will help retired clergy, church staff, and their families to pay bills, maintain health insurance, and meet emergency needs. Year after year, our gifts make a difference, easing the anxiety of constant financial worries. Last year, the Christmas Fund, administered by the Pension Boards of the United Church of Christ, provided over \$1.6 million in pension and health benefits supplementation, emergency grants, and thank-you checks to retired servants of the church and their families. Every cent of that money came from the pockets of people like you. Please give as generously as you are able this year! (Luke 2:10)

### In 2021, gifts to the Christmas Fund enabled:

- Monthly pension supplementation for 231 retired clergy and lay employees (\$1,104,479)
- Health benefits supplementation for 87 retired clergy and lay employees (\$177,600)
- Emergency grants for 53 individuals and families (\$150,338)
- Christmas "Thank You" gift checks to 509 retired clergy and lay employees (\$254,000)

## Thanksgiving Baskets by Ericka Tyler

Our 2022 Thanksgiving basket project was a great success thanks to the efforts of many community and individual volunteers. The United Church of Christ was able to provide a total of 100 families with either a gift card and basket filled with Thanksgiving foods or at least a gift card. The project was definitely a group effort from beginning to end! Weeks of planning began months prior to our culminating event. Many phone calls were made (and made again), boxes and bags secured, donations requested, and plenty of shopping done! We are extremely blessed to have received a generous donation of food products and money from the Alvogen company in Norwich! Thank you also to Carlo Masi Sons & Daughter in Utica who donated toward the cost of the produce!

Finally, church and community volunteers gathered on a Sunday afternoon to separate and bag produce, including potatoes, apples, and carrots. Others packed boxes with gravy, vegetables, cranberry sauce, and stuffing. On Monday, the boxes were topped off with butter and rolls or bread. Generous donations of bread or rolls came from Magro's, Nina's, and the Cottage Bakery, all located in Norwich. We are so thankful for this!

In addition, the Norwich City School District and a local Girl Scout troop collected their own donations and created 24 additional boxes and donated 10 gift cards for us to give away. This brought our total up to 134 families being served!

The local community didn't stop there. Between the Emmanuel Episcopal Church, St. Bartholomew Catholic Church, and the City Church of Norwich, an additional 250 Thanksgiving boxes were provided to families in need.

It takes a great deal of planning, organization, effort, and old fashioned manual labor to complete a project like this. I'll admit, there were times when I simply wished we had our precious Linda here to guide us on what to do. But, we did it! Families were blessed. And they were so thankful! Linda, we thank you so much for your years of tireless work on this mission. I hope we have made you proud!

On behalf of the volunteers and clients that are part of Our Daily Bread Food Pantry, we want to thank you for the donation you made in early October. As you know, we are now giving our families a 5 day/15 meal package and have increased the amount of milk that we give each household on the milk voucher. Your donation will help with the increase in food that we need to be able to do this. Our clients continue to be grateful for the food and milk that we are able to give them. We couldn't provide food for the numbers of people that we're feeding without generous donations like yours. With the increase in food and gas prices, we have seen an increase in the number of families coming to the pantry for the past five months. In September, we provided food to 114 households, consisting of 121 children, 215 adults and 26 seniors. We assume this will continue and are happy that we can be there to assist families.


