From the Pastor

Lent! Wait, what? OK, OK. It's not here yet. But it is coming. Ash Wednesday is February 22. We hope you will join us for worship that evening at 7pm, which will be a community Ash Wednesday Service and Ukraine Prayer Service. Our Lenten journey soon begins, but we have some stops along the way coming.

Mardi Gras! A new tradition begins this year as with good humor and celebration, we will have our "Feast Before Fast" on Sunday, February 19. Grab your beads and masks and your boas, pull out your most garish apparel, and laissez les bons temps roulez! Your Spirit will be lifted high with a joyous worship that Sunday morning, followed by a wonderful New Orleans-style potluck meal together in the Founder's Room. A huge thanks to Pat Burke for coordinating, and to all those who have signed up to help her. Don't hesitate to be in touch with her to offer your help as well.

Soon thereafter we enter into one of the holiest times of the year, a walk through the 40 days and 40 nights which leads us to the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. Our Lenten worship will include a new ritual this year, similar to our candles of Advent, a Service of Diminishing Lights. Our first Lenten Sunday is February 26.

That number, 40, is significant beyond just the number of days in Lent. Frequently in scripture, the number 40 is a bit of a metaphor for "a long time." In other words, 40 doesn't always mean 40. So, when you count the number of days from Ash Wednesday to Easter and notice it's 46, it's OK. I promise. Technically, Sundays don't "count." We don't have to be exact with this.

The scriptures tell us that Moses spent 40 days on Mount Sinai with God, and that God's chosen people wandered the desert for 40 years. The story of the Noah and the flood included 40 days of rain, and when the story of Jesus being tempted in the desert had him there for – you guessed it – 40 days. We have that symbolism of '40' and we know that it represented significant time.


Historically, fasting is one of the more commonly selected Lenten disciplines. Giving up chocolate or coffee for Lent, as difficult as that sounds to some of our ears, is common – as is giving up some other food. But if you are seeking a Lenten discipline, fasting from a food is not your only option. Perhaps holding on to your coffee and

chocolate and letting go of something else might be more faithful for you. As Lent is a time for us to prepare ourselves for the coming Resurrection, are there other ways that you might make ready for the Risen Christ? Is there penance you need to make? Are there things for which you need to seek forgiveness? If you often forget to spend time in prayer, you might even try "fasting from forgetting," committing yourself to that important time connecting with God.

Or are there other things in your life and world which keep you from being closer to God? Might you fast from them and see where the Spirit leads you? Be well and blessed on your Lenten journey.

Children and Family Ministries

Change is upon us! After a few weeks of research and review, a new curriculum has finally been chosen for our Sunday School program! The program is called *Grow* **Students.** This program is designed to work in person and/or online and can be adapted to use with both our upper elementary as well as middle school age youth. The curriculum will come packed with resources, including 50 weeks of lesson plans, short (1 minute!) video sermons for each week, weekly Teaching Guides, games and activities, discipleship tools, and much more! The program is interactive, discussion-driven, and centered around four basic spiritual habits that lead to long term spiritual growth. Grow believes that "spiritual growth should be the lens through which we see everything else we do in our ministries." In order for our children to grow closer to God, we need to help them engage in these habits on a regular basis! Throughout the next year, the four spiritual habits your children will be focusing on include spending time with others, spending time with God, using their gifts. and sharing their story. In addition to these, the program addresses other important topics such as family and friendship, identity, wisdom, loving others, hurt & pain, doubt, justice, and evangelism. I cannot wait to receive the curriculum and get started with our new Grow program!

Aside from a new program, we have also chosen to adjust our Sunday School lesson time! The new time will be *during* the worship service, after the Children's Moment. When the Children's Moment has concluded, children will be invited to head upstairs with both myself and Leona (our assistant) to begin our lesson. Sunday School will conclude around the time the worship service ends each week. Please stay tuned for an official start date as we await the arrival of our new curriculum.

Keep checking your weekly church bulletin and watch for email updates about both the Sunday School program and our new teen Youth Group! I will also do my best to keep you updated with regard to the renovation progress of the Youth Room. When the time comes, I will likely

be asking for help moving furniture and supplies from our old Sunday School room to our new one!
