God's Doors are Open to All



From the Pastor

Nearly 20 years ago, the celebrated author and Presbyterian minister Frederick Buechner gave an interview called "Easter Hope in a Time of War" to PBS correspondent Kim Lawton. In my own time, the ongoing war in Ukraine and the global implications have been stirring intensely in my soul, and I've been thinking a lot about this in recent weeks, as we've been moving through Lent and looking forward to the day of resurrection.

Buechner's words then reflect much of what we hear from folks all around us now. He described himself as a pessimist about the affairs of the world, but he also offered a reminder to us: "But I feel ultimately that beneath the level of all the madness and horror is this saving, life-giving, nourishing, healing, beautiful, mystery is the best word for it — that somehow an elusive, holy plan is being worked out in the affairs of the earth."

I think that is important for us to keep in our minds and our hearts, that God is working in the world even despite all of this. Not in terms of some grand plan, as though what we are seeing on the news is somehow planned by God (be assured, it's not), but rather in the ways we see people we know who have heard what God's Holy Spirit has said to them. In the most recent years, we needed to remind ourselves that Covid would not have the final word; now we must remind ourselves Putin will not have the final word—that belongs to God. Easter Sunday is many things, and among them is our annual reminder of that, of God's final word: that we, too, rise in the resurrection.

Toward the end of the interview, the reporter reminded viewers, "On Easter Sunday, in church after church, year after year, sorrow gives way to rejoicing as Christians celebrate the idea that death doesn't have the final word. Pageantry, singing, flowers, even new clothes all symbolize the Christian belief that Jesus overcame death—and so will all who believe. It's a victory, Christians say, that transcends time and circumstance."

That transcendence matters. We may not forget all that happens in our world, but that we still rise up above all that is making our lives so challenging and causing such pain around the globe to rejoice in the good news of Easter matters. Perhaps even more so than usual. The sounding trumpets of Easter morning and glorious processions into churches around the globe will not send Russian troops home from Ukraine. Even more so than usual, our transcendence matters. The Resurrection has come in war and famine, in economic hardship and natural disaster, in times of plague and in good times as well. To borrow and play with words from Maya Angelou, on that day of resurrection even in the worst of times, and still we rise. With Christ who will rise, and still we rise.

I won't say the A-word yet. It's not time — that comes Easter morning. But I'm getting ready to. We have Palm Sunday and Holy Week to come, with Maundy Thursday in our Sanctuary and a Community Good Friday service at Broad Street Methodist Church. It is ours to experience those fully as well to bring ourselves the fullest grasp of Easter morning. But make no mistake, it comes. The "it is finished" of Good Friday will not be the final word — never has been and never will be — that will be "He is risen." In this time and all times, Jesus Christ is resurrected and we remain people of the resurrection. Amen.

He teed off on the first hole. A huge gust of wind caught his ball, carried it an extra hundred yards and dropped it right in the hole, for a 450-yard hole in one.








Earth Day Sunday at UCC Norwich
