From the Pastor

Rev. Jason Boyd

I wish this was something we could dismiss as a joke, and it does have a certain gallows humor quality to it, but it is nonetheless true. In 2019, the polling company Civic Science asked 3,624 American adults whether schools in this country should teach Arabic Numerals as part of their curriculum; 56% responded **NO**.

I suppose it's a good thing that I have long since finished school, and also that I think I largely remember my Roman Numerals from days gone by. ©

I write to you this morning having just gotten home from getting my 6th Covid shot. I was joking with the pharmacist about other things which I wish we had vaccines against, but of course that isn't exactly how life works. I wish we could develop a vaccine against hate and discrimination.

But hate and discrimination persist. Our nation is currently facing a significant escalation of anti-LGBTQ legislation, including movements intended to essentially eliminate LGBTQ people from public life. It has gotten so severe that this August the Canadian government issued a travel warning for LGBTQ Canadians visiting the US.

Hate and discrimination based on race persist as well. In the statistic I mentioned at the start, we might find ourselves amused that a significant portion of our population does not know that the numbers we use in all aspects of our everyday lives are properly called Arabic Numerals. But let us not kid ourselves that the response of a majority of those asked was based on the word 'Arabic.' That is racist.

You have heard me say at announcement time in church, you have received the information from the church office in the mail, and you will find elsewhere in this newsletter the information about this upcoming anti-racism Adult Christian Education program which Rev. Gary Smith will be facilitating in our church. I am so pleased to have Broad Street United Methodist Church and Christ Lutheran Church as partners in this journey.

As the time for this journey is soon upon us, I also want to invite you to do some holy reading before we begin. I highly urge you to get hold of a copy of a book called "Caste: The Origin of our Discontents," by Isabel Wilkerson, or even listen

to it on CD in the car as I did on my recent trip to Newfoundland. Likewise, "White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk About Racism" by Robin DiAngelo is well worth your time. I can assure you that you will benefit from having read these books.

I very much want to urge you to make the time to participate. We have much to explore, and likely much to unpack. Rev. Smith is going to lead us on a very important journey. I pray you will be intentional about being part of this journey.

The Bell Choir is back in action!





Welcome back to Sunday School! I hope that everyone had a wonderful and relaxing summer.

This month, we are going to dive right into a study of the Old and New Testaments and learn what it means to truly love others. More specifically, how do we respond when someone hurts us? Or perhaps when we hurt someone we love? Apologies are hard to give, but they're sometimes hard to receive, too. When you're the one who has hurt someone else, saying you're sorry (and actually meaning it) takes work and practice. But when you're the one who's been hurt by someone else, things get even more complicated. What if you don't want to forgive them? What if they don't seem sorry? What if they won't even admit they're wrong? What if they've moved on, but you're still not over it? In our fourweek series, we'll find out what it means to truly give and receive forgiveness. We'll discover that when you need forgiveness, it's not enough to just apologize. And when you've been hurt and need to forgive, we'll explore the importance of shifting your perspective, remembering God forgave first, and remembering Jesus knows what it's like to be hurt.

In other news, our fall youth group is set to begin on Saturday, September 30, 2023! This group, named *Free 2B Me*, will be a non-structured, safe space for students in 5th through 12th grades to simply come relax, listen to music, play games, socialize with peers, have some snacks, and most importantly, feel free to be who God made them to be! If you know of someone who may be interested, let them know about this great opportunity for fellowship! The group will meet most Saturdays from 4-6 pm in the Youth Room.

Let's Talk Race

Broad Street United Methodist Church, Christ Lutheran Church, and the United Church of Christ First Congregational of Norwich invite you to join us for *Let's Talk Race*, an amazing sevenweek journey where we create brave space and speak truthfully about racism in our nation.

During our time together we will explore the history of racism including its relationship with American Christianity; the connection between bias, stereotypes, and microaggressions (and how to respond when they occur!); the challenges of white privilege and white privilege resistance; and the effects of redlining and the "zero sum paradigm". We end by teaching the skills necessary to live as an antiracist person of faith. Each session will last two hours and include videos, discussion, and reflection.

Let's Talk Race will take place this Autumn on seven "almost consecutive" Tuesdays from 6:30pm to 8:30pm in the Founders Room at the United Church of Christ, located at 11 West Main Street in downtown Norwich. The dates are as follows:

October 17 & 24 November 7, 14, & 28 December 5 & 12

Presenting and facilitating the program is Rev. Gary Smith, Founding Director of the Center for Racial Justice and Racial Justice Consultant for the New York Conference of the United Church of Christ. He has 20 years of experience in faith-based community organizing and antiracism education. In addition to his antiracism work, Rev. Smith serves as Pastor of Malden Road United Church of Christ in Syracuse.

Livestream Team Jen Mallozzi and Chris McSweeney


