SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

WE COME TO THE TABLE

ONE: We give you our thanks and praise, O God, creator of all things, visible and invisible.

ALL: You revealed your glory in the wonders of your creation and in the way you lovingly formed people in your image and entrusted them with the ongoing task of revealing your glory in the world.
